The Giovanni and Anna De Gasperis ♦ Eugene and Eva Kohn Learning Centre at Cortellucci Vaughan Hospital is one of the first and most comprehensive learning and conference centres within a Canadian hospital. Featuring an auditorium, conference and break-out spaces alongside laboratories for clinical teaching and health simulation, it is both a hub for continuous learning and development within the hospital and a catalyst for knowledge sharing with community members, health experts and organizations beyond our walls.

ONE-STOP CONTINUOUS LEARNING

From the latest electronic medical record updates to new best practices for surgical care, Mackenzie Health's administrative and clinical staff are constantly upgrading and refining their skills to improve patient care and outcomes. In the new, high-tech centre for continuous learning at Cortellucci Vaughan Hospital, our team has one-stop access to a range of integrated learning opportunities, from large-scale lectures and small-group workshops, to computer-based learning and hands-on training and simulations.

CONNECTING WITH THE WORLD

Using technology, we link our team with continuing medical education and certificate courses and experts throughout the region and beyond. The clinical teaching laboratory also includes videoconferencing and digital file sharing capabilities to allow Mackenzie Health's clinicians to consult on complex cases across our two hospital sites, at our community-based locations and with specialists at other health care centres.

INTRODUCING THE GIOVANNI AND ANNA DE GASPERIS ♦ EUGENE AND EVA KOHN LEARNING CENTRE

Named to honour two generous philanthropic families, the Giovanni and Anna De Gasperis ♦ Eugene and Eva Kohn Learning Centre includes four distinct learning areas:

BERWICK FAMILY AUDITORIUM

A high-tech, multi-purpose space capable of seating up to 400 in one large or up to three smaller rooms, the Berwick Family Auditorium is an ideal venue for large hospital meetings, events and conferences involving the Mackenzie Health team and our many health care and academic partners.

The auditorium can also host patient and public events addressing current health and wellness topics, and community information meetings hosted by Mackenzie Health and Mackenzie Health Foundation.

CONFERENCE AND LEARNING SPACES

Immediately adjacent to the auditorium, the Learning Centre's two classrooms include removable walls to create up to four break-out rooms outfitted with the latest learning tools and technologies. One of the two classrooms also provides remote videoconferencing to support continuing medical education for our physicians and certification courses for our allied health providers. Another two Information Communication Automation Technology training classrooms offer computer-based learning in subjects ranging from software upgrades to the electronic medical records system.

CLINICAL TEACHING LABORATORY

In the Clinical Teaching Laboratory, physicians, nurses and other allied health professionals receive instructional and hands-on training in new clinical and technical skills, such as how to use cardiac, telemetry and neurologic equipment. The 50-seat laboratory also includes videoconferencing and digital file-sharing capabilities to support consultations between clinicians at Mackenzie Health and our partner hospitals throughout the region.

SIMULATION LABORATORIES

Rehearsing team responses to a cardiac arrest or how to intubate a newborn are just two of the many mock procedures and skills training sessions that are available in Cortellucci Vaughan Hospital's two simulation laboratories. Connected by a control room that doubles as an observatory, the labs offer a simulated hospital environment where clinicians can safely practice their diagnostic, surgical and problem-solving techniques and procedures on high-tech mannequins before applying them in a live hospital setting.

A PARTNERSHIP FIRST WITH VAUGHAN PUBLIC LIBRARY

Steps away from the Learning Centre, along Cortellucci Vaughan Hospital's Promenade Main Street corridor, clinicians, staff, patients and their families have access to a fully-functioning branch of the Vaughan Public Library. Bright and spacious with glazed glass walls, the 4,000-square-foot facility features the same access to books, resources and programming available at every Vaughan Public Library branch, including educational activities for children, families and members of the public, and electronic databases on wide-ranging subjects, including health and medicine.



The Giovanni and Anna De Gasperis ♦ Eugene and Eva Kohn Learning Centre is highly visible from Major Mackenzie Drive and prominently positioned near the main hospital entrance, where its showpiece architectural design and strategic location symbolize Mackenzie Health's commitment to creating the ultimate health experience through learning, development and innovation.

- 1 The Learning Centre is accessible through a dedicated entrance with a canopied drop-off area and also via the east-wing of the Promenade Main Street corridor, just inside Cortellucci Vaughan Hospital's main entrance.
- 2 The auditorium, classrooms and laboratories are clustered around a large glass-walled outdoor courtyard that brings natural light into the corridor and offers learners space for rest and reflection. It also serves as a fitting venue for hospital, patient and public events and gatherings.
- 3 A service elevator connecting the conference centre and hospital catering kitchen allows ready access for meals and refreshments.
- 4 All the learning spaces feature the latest sound, video and digital technologies, and are accessible remotely for presentations, workshops and training sessions at Mackenzie Health's network of sites, including Mackenzie Richmond Hill Hospital and our community-based locations.
- 5 The Centre's green roof is part of Cortellucci Vaughan Hospital's pursuit of a Silver LEED Canada certification and reflects Mackenzie Health's commitment to environmental leadership.
